Dress Code

Everyone

All clothes must be modest and loose fitting. No attire with questionable writing or graphics will be allowed. No shorts are allowed during the evening chapel service. If wearing shorts, skirts or culottes, please sit modestly and appropriately in order to prevent your clothing from riding up on your thigh.

Girls/Ladies

Dresses, skirts, culottes, or loose-fitting athletic shorts are approved attire. All should be at least knee length. All tops must be modest. No sleeveless shirts, tank tops, or pants for girls.

Young ladies are encouraged to wear a knee length dress or knee length skirt and modest top to evening services. No shorts or athletic attire may be worn during evening services.

Swim wear must be 1 piece or full coverage 2 piece (no bikinis). Campers and Counselors should be fully dressed (shorts and shirt) coming and going to the springs.

Boys/Men

Jeans, khakis, loose fitting athletic pants, or shorts are approved attire. All shorts should be knee length.

Young men are encouraged to wear collared shirts to evening services. No shorts or athletic attire may be worn during evening services.

Swim wear includes modest shorts or swim trunks. Campers and Counselors should be fully dressed (shorts and shirt) coming and going to the swimming area.

No jewelry (except for medical identification purposes).

Basic Info

Ages/Grades Eligible to Attend

Junior campers are children 3rd grade (8 years old) through 6th grade (12/13 years old). Teen campers are young people currently in 7th-12th grade. Questions about age restrictions may be directed to Tim Russell and are primarily up to each church's discretion.

What to Pack

Bible, sleeping bag or bedding for twin mattress, pillow, appropriate attire for services, activities, and swimming (see dress code), toiletries (toothpaste, deodorant, soaps, etc.), towel(s), money for snacks, sunscreen, bug spray, flashlight.

Do not bring

Gaming devices, headphones, weapons, drugs, alcohol, vaping devices, movies, fireworks, or lighters.

Basketball, volleyball, gaga ball, zip line, climbing wall, human foosball, lakeside swimming area with loads of water activities, and much more!

Competitions

FOR SENIOR CAMPERS

- We will divide all of the teen campers from all of the churches into 4 separate teams that will compete in various indoor and outdoor competitions throughout the week.
- We plan to have church versus church volleyball (5v5) and basketball (3v3) for both guys and girls. (Rules and information at the end of this form)
- We plan to have a music (solo, group, and instrumental) competition and preaching competition. (Rules and information at the end of this form)

FOR JUNIOR CAMPERS

- Most competitions will be boys vs. girls.

Teen Basketball Tournament Rules

- This will be a double elimination style tournament. (unless another format is determined to be better based on the number of teams participating.)
- Each game will be played on a half court with one basket.
- A coin toss will determine who receives the ball first.
- Every successful shot inside the arc is awarded one point, while every successful shot behind the arc is awarded two points.
- The games will be a single period of 8-10 minutes. The winner will be the first team to score 21 points or the team with the highest score at the end of the time period. A tie in regulation leads to an untimed overtime period, which is won when one team achieves a 2 point advantage.
- Game play starts with the defensive team exchanging the ball with the offensive team behind the arc. This exchange is also used to restart the game from any dead ball situation. If a foul is committed that results in the non-fouling team retaining possession the non-fouling team will receive the exchange.
- If the defense gains possession of the ball within the arc, by a steal, a block or a rebound, the team must move the ball behind the arc before being allowed to take a shot.
- After a made goal or free throw play restarts with a player from the non-scoring team taking the ball directly under the basket and then dribbling or passing it to a point behind the arc. The defense is not allowed to play for the ball inside the block/charge semi-circle under the basket.
- A substitution can only occur during a dead ball. The team captain must inform the referee of the substitution before play can resume. Illegal substitutions result in one free throw to opposing team.
- Each team is allowed one timeout (The official may still stop the game in case of player injury or other dangerous situations).
- Individual personal foul counts are not kept. In other words, players cannot be disqualified on the basis of personal fouls. However, a player who commits two unsportsmanlike, or flagrant fouls is disqualified. (Referees determine flagrant fouls)
- A Christlike attitude is the most important part of this tournament. Poor attitudes from players and/or observers will not be tolerated and may result in forfeit of the game. (Proverbs 25:28)

Teen Volleyball Tournament Rules

- This will be a double elimination style tournament. (unless another format is determined to be better based on the number of teams participating.)
- There is a maximum of 3 hits per side
- Points are made on every serve for winning team of rally (rally-point scoring).
- A player may not hit the ball twice in succession. (A block is not considered a hit.)
- The ball may be played off the net during a volley and on a serve.
- A player's person may not hit the net while attacking the ball (small incidental contact will not counted).
- A ball hitting a boundary line is in bounds.
- It is legal to contact the ball with any part of a player's body.
- It is illegal to catch, hold or throw the ball (carrying-rule).
- A player cannot block or spike a serve.
- All players must rotate after change of possessions.
- After the serve, front-line players may switch positions at the net.
- Each game will be played to 21. You must win by 2, or be the first team to reach 25 points.
- To begin the game, a "volley for serve" will determine who serves first.
- Individuals may only play for one team. Individuals are not allowed to switch teams or sub for a different team.
- Selections of the initial tournament bracket and match ups will be done at random.
- A Christlike attitude is the most important part of this tournament. Poor attitudes from players or observers will not be tolerated and result in a forfeit of the game. (Proverbs 25:28)

Music Competition Information

Music competitions will be overseen by Trey and Hannah Graf of Grace Baptist Church in Sperry, OK

- There will be separate competitions for junior and senior campers.
- We will have two categories in the vocal competition – solos and groups (of any size). We will have an instrumental competition as well.
- Entries are limited to 3 per category per church.
- Please limit all music selections to around 3 minutes.
- Your church's group leader/pastor should pre-approve song choices to ensure they are conservative Christian songs appropriate for a church service.
- The purpose of this competition is to encourage young people to serve the Lord with the talents He has given them. Singers should strive to improve in every area which affects their ability to honor God, which is why they will be judged and critiqued. All critiques will be constructional.
- Each soloist/group/musician will be judged by physical appearance/attire, blend, platform presence, technique, arrangement, tone quality, audience contact, and enunciation.
- Sunday dress is appropriate for the contest. Young men should wear a collared shirt with a tie, while young ladies should wear a nice dress or skirt and top.
- We ask that you not use soundtracks and that you not play an instrument while you sing. If you do not have your own accompanist, please send your music selections to the talent competition coordinators and we will have one of our accompanists play for you.

Preaching Competition Information

- This preaching competition is reserved for male campers only.
- Entries are limited to 3 student preachers per church.
- Young men should prepare 1 sermon approximately 5-8 minutes in length.
- Each preacher will be judged by their physical appearance/attire, platform presence, eye contact, enunciation, content (interpretation of the passage, application, illustration), and ability to stay within the time constraints.
- The young men are encouraged to seek advice from their pastor or youth pastor while constructing their sermon. However, the young men are expected to create their own original outline/sermon.
- Sunday dress is appropriate for the contest. Men should wear a dress shirt and tie. Sports coat/suit jacket is optional.

Cabin Cleanup

Cabin Cleanup Preparation

Every church group should bring its own cleaning supplies (disinfectant, glass cleaner, brooms, rags or paper towels, toilet bowl cleaner and scrubber, etc.). You may also want to bring your own hand soap. That is prone to run out. The camp will provide trash bags and replace paper towels for hand drying. These supplies are most easily obtained in the lodge cleaning closet or by checking with a camp WOW staff member.

Every group sharing a dorm room with another church should collaborate with the other group leader about dorm cleaning responsibilities. Please do not leave all of the cleaning to one group.

Cabin Cleanup Expectations

- Beds made.
- Luggage orderly.
- Wet clothes and towels hung up (not on floor).
- Bathroom sinks, toilets, and showers wiped down and tidy (No hair or other undesirable waste. Any items you choose to leave out in the bathrooms should be neat and tidy.)
- Mirrors cleaned.
- Floors swept (no trash on the ground but in trash cans).
- Once trash can is full, set bag outside of dorm door. (A trash can with trash in it will not be counted against you. Only trash anywhere else.)
- Each dorm will be judged for smelly odors, so you may want to bring air fresheners.
- Do not leave fans running.

We also expect all of our campers to work extra hard to keep the property and all building clean and free of trash. Our desire is to maintain our reputation of the most respectful and cleanest group.

Church Packing List

Necessary Items

- Bedding for twin size bunk bed – Sheets and blanket or sleeping bag, pillow.
- Toiletry Items – Bodywash, shampoo, towel, washcloth, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, sunscreen, & other necessities.
- Clothes – 4 sets of nicer clothes for services, clothing for the various activities, pajamas, plenty of undergarments and socks, swimwear, beach towel, rain gear, sweater for cool evenings.
- Shoes – Tennis shoes or closed toed shoes are required to do Rockwall and field activities. Water shoes are highly recommended to wear while swimming. Having extra pairs of shoes (especially for services) are recommended as one pair inevitably gets wet or muddy.
- Bible
- Medications
 - All medications should be given to your church leader to administer.
 - We will have camp nurses, but they are only for injuries and emergencies. Not medication oversight.
- Water Bottle – There are water bottle refill stations located around camp.

Optional Items

- Flashlight
- Small bag or backpack
- Notebook & pen/pencil
- Money for Snack Shack, vending, or merchandise
- Light jacket or rain jacket (be weather aware)
- Nicer clothes for services

Things You Should NOT Bring

- Weapons of any kind (including pocket knives)
- Fireworks or other explosives
- Drugs or Alcohol (Prescription medication must be submitted to leaders)
- Electronics (including cell phones, tablets, and headphones)

Golf Cart and Lodge Room Rental Information

Golf Cart Rentals

Golf cart rentals are \$225 each for 2 seaters and \$275 for 4 seaters. I would need to know if you have a preference for a 2 or 4 seater golf cart when the reservation is made. Otherwise, you will get whatever is left over.

You will be responsible for your golf cart key, so we recommend keeping your key on your person or bringing a special key chain to help mark your key. Any lost or broken keys will result in a \$25 fee.

Lodge Room Rentals

Lodge rooms are \$250 each for the week or \$75 per night. This is in addition to the individual camper fee of \$275 per person.

Each room has its own private bathroom. Bedding is provided along with a few towels. You may still want to bring your own bedding and towels depending on your preferences. You may want to bring a box fan as some rooms have box fans, but not all.
